Voting "yes" for local levy referendum means voting "yes" for New Discoveries Montessori Academy

Whether you live in Cokato, Dassel, Hutchinson, or any Independent School District (ISD) NDMA serves, your "yes" vote means NDMA will receive the State of Minnesota portion of the approved levy for every student from the Independent School Districts we serve (who have an approved excess levy referendum).

For example, in the case of Hutchinson Public Schools, if the community supports both the renewal and the second question, the levy referendum portion of school property taxes will not go up compared to 2013 school taxes. This is due to the fact that the State of Minnesota will pay 59% of the first \$300 per pupil in levy referendum revenue. From \$301 to \$760 per pupil, the State of Minnesota will pay for 29% of the levy referendum revenue. The State's financial contribution to local levies provides property tax relief for local taxpayers.

A "yes" vote on the two questions will provide \$350 per student in revenue for NDMA for each year of the levy.

Election Day is November 5, 2013.



Celebration-Eligible Status

Did you know that New Discoveries Montessori Academy climbed from the bottom 5% of Minnesota's 853 Title I schools in 2012 with our Multiple Measurement Rating (MMR) to the top 40% of that same group of schools in just one year's time? According to Minnesota Department of Education Commissioner, Brenda Cassellius, ". . . due to (NDMA's) substantial progress in raising achievement for all students and reducing the achievement gaps, . . ." NDMA is no longer a Priority School! Instead, we are now eligible for Celebration School status. Our leadership team recently submitted an application for this competitive award, the recipients of which will be announced in December.



E2 Students Present to PTO:

Learning Discovered through visit to Audubon Center of The North Woods, Sandstone, MN.

Yearly, E2 students partake in a three-day, two-night, environmental learning fieldtrip at the Audubon Center of the Northwoods, located in Sandstone, MN. This fieldtrip encompasses the Montessori and Minnesota State academic science standard requirements. While at Audubon, students are actively involved in hands-on learning of several different topics.

All three of the E2 classes enjoyed learning about *Stream Superheroes* (Aquatic macro invertebrate's role in the ecosystem - water pollution), as well as several other exciting lessons including *Team Challenge*, *High Ropes*, and *Rock Climbing Wall*.

This year we added a follow up component to our agenda. Upon return from Audubon the students were required to select one of their experiences and complete a report. Students were given several options for report format, but needed to include what they learned about the subject, how they can use the learning at school, outside of school, as well as in the world at large (in the future).

The PTO has actively raised funds to help offset costs for this fieldtrip. On Tuesday, October 22nd, E2 students presented their final projects to the PTO to acknowledge how important this trip was for them, and what an awesome opportunity it is for NDMA students in the future.
